NJ Senator FRED MADDEN



Mr. Madden was elected to the Senate in 2003 and re-elected five times. Prior to his legislative service, he was a law enforcement officer. He rose to the rank of lieutenant colonel in the New Jersey State Police and led the force of 4,000 enlisted and civilian employees as acting superintendent. He left that post in February 2003, to run for the Senate.

Senator Madden has sponsored legislation to protect children and support veterans and first responders. He sponsored legislation that requires certain sexual predators to wear global positioning system (GPS) devices to allow tracking by law enforcement. He authored a 2007

law to keep schools and child care centers from opening on contaminated sites, drafted in response to a daycare center found to be operating on the grounds of a former thermometer factory in Gloucester County.

The senator sponsored a bill giving surviving spouses of fallen police officers and firefighters permanent workers' compensation. He pushed for the law that makes the transition into the classroom easier for veterans, and a measure honoring New Jersey's service members by designating November of each year Veterans' Month.

The senator's State Police career started in 1975, after he graduated first in his recruit training class. Under his command, the State Police established an Internet sexual offender registry, a computer crimes initiative to combat crimes against children. He also served as a member of New Jersey's State Domestic Preparedness Task Force to address issues of homeland security and counterterrorism.

Senator Madden earned an associate of science degree in law enforcement from Camden County Community College, a B.A. from Glassboro State College (now Rowan University) and an M.S. in criminal justice administration from St. Joseph's University, Philadelphia. He has taught as an adjunct professor at Seton Hall and Rutgers Universities.

Senator Madden and his wife, Patti, a registered nurse, have eight grandchildren. Authority, serving for five years as the agency's ethics liaison officer.



Assemblyman WILLIAM W. SPEARMAN



Chairman Spearman has represented the 5th Legislative District in the New Jersey Assembly since June 30th, 2018. Since January 2022, he is the Chair of Law and Public Safety, Vice Chair of Agriculture and Food Security and also sits on the Transportation and Independent Authorities as well as Infrastructure and Natural Resources Committee.


Raised in Camden, New Jersey, Spearman attended and graduated from Woodrow Wilson High School before later seeking higher education from what are now his Alma Maters of Rowan and Temple respectively. Spearman pursued Business Management for which he would later go on to


receive his B.S. degree, as well as his eventual completion of his M.B.A. on the subject of Real Estate and Urban Land studies. While attending to his studies, Spearman worked as a real estate agent before taking an internship at Cooper's Ferry Development Association (CFDA). He later went on to become a full time CFDA employee, and it was his charge to manage and oversee projects which include the completion of the River Shark Stadium construction, Phase IV of the Wiggins Waterfront Park construction, and Building 17 improvements. Spearman worked for 11 years in a position which facilitated his role in improving infrastructure within Camden county, and he would go on to serve his community further by later taking on the responsibility of Councilman, a position he would hold for six years.

Chairman Spearman served as an ethics liaison officer for the South Jersey Transportation Authority, for which his role was to ensure compliance to State and Federal rules and regulations. That is still not to mention his continued service to his community through the Camden Redevelopment Agency for which he is the secretary of the Marching Panthers Boosters.

Chairman William Spearman is also responsible for the sponsoring of a number of significant bills which have since been passed through into the New Jersey legislature. It was Assembly Spearman who endorsed the meal vouchers program whose purpose required schools having to provide meals/meal vouchers to students who would normally benefit from free/reduced food in school but were unable to due to closures caused by the Coronavirus. William Spearman also sponsored a bill that had the specific purpose of drug reform as it pertains to both marijuana and the expungement of records previously associated with it, as well as pushing for an increased awareness of such record cleaning services and the applicability thereof.
